COMPLETE THE 2020 CENSUS

Census 2020 has started. Everyone should already have received their mailed invitation to respond to the Census. You can respond online at <https://2020census.gov/>, by phone at 844-330-2020 or by mail, all without leaving the safety of your own home.

It's very important for New Jersey that every resident gets counted, regardless of age or immigration status. Our Congressional representation depends on it. Over \$1 trillion in Federal funding is allocated nationally based wholly or in part on Census counts. In these challenging times, it is especially true that continued funding for healthcare, health insurance, and emergency response resources is critical. Let's make sure that new Jersey gets our fair share by achieving a complete count of all our residents.

REMEMBER TO WEAR FACE COVERINGS

On Wednesday, April 8, 2020, Governor Phil Murphy signed Executive Order No. 122 requiring New Jersey shoppers to wear a face covering while on a store's premises except where doing so would inhibit that individual's health. The use of simple cloth face coverings slows the spread of the virus and keeps people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others.

Residents are reminded to continue to keep about 6 feet between themselves and others. The cloth face cover is not a substitute for social distancing. It is also important to keep washing your hands!

Additional information and instructions on how to make a face covering, including a no-sew method, can be found at cdc.gov/coronavirus. One of our members has been making masks and giving them to seniors who want one. There is a bag of masks near the front door of the center. If you need one, stop by and pick one up.

VOTE BY MAIL

As American citizens, it is our privilege and our duty to vote. Union County Clerk, Joanne Rajoppi, advises voters-at-risk to plan ahead and use Vote-by-Mail to participate in the upcoming Primary Election, in accordance with guidance from health officials regarding the coronavirus COVID-19.

Voters who have never used a Vote-by-Mail ballot can apply for one now, by visiting the County Clerk's elections website at unioncountylvotes.com for a downloadable version. To have an application sent by mail, call the County Clerk's Elections Division at 908-527-4996.

After the Vote-by-Mail application is approved, the voter will receive their ballot prior to Election Day.

Important Dates:

- Tuesday, June 16 - Last day to register to vote for the Primary Election. Your *Voter-Registration-Application* must be filed by this date.
- Tuesday, June 30 - Last day to apply by mail for a Mail-In-Ballot for the Primary Election. Your *Application-For-Vote-By-Mail-Ballot* must be received by the County Clerk by this date.
- Tuesday, July 7 - Primary Election Day. If returning your *Mail-in Ballot* by mail, it must be postmarked no later than Election Day and received by the County Board of Elections no later than 48 hours after the time of the closing of the polls for the election.

On Wednesday, April 8, 2020, Governor Phil Murphy signed Executive Order No. 120 postponing primary elections to Tuesday, July 7th in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. This includes primaries for President, the U.S. Senate, the U.S. House of Representatives, the 25th District of the New Jersey Legislature and county and municipal elections, as well as county committee elections.
