



DONATION DO'S

Make space and reduce waste by dropping off your unwanted items that still have plenty of life in them. We are looking for garage sale-worthy donations that will be happy in someone else's home. Examples:

- Well-functioning small appliances
- Gently loved toys and children's play equipment
- Home accessories and accents (small side tables, planters, artwork, frames, decorative items, etc.)
- Leftover unused craft supplies
- Jewelry, handbags, and luggage
- Clean, new, or gently used pet-related items
- Exercise equipment
- Mobility aids such as walkers, canes, and wheelchairs

DONATION DONT'S

The rule of common sense covers many of our "NO" categories. If it is damaged, dangerous, or otherwise unusable, we ask you not to donate it. There are some other items we will be restricting this year for space and safety reasons, so please check this list before bringing your donation to the event.

- NO large furniture items such as mattresses, sofas, beds, dining tables, etc. (anything too large for one person to carry)
- NO items containing hazardous materials (paint, rusty nails or other safety concerns)
- NO weapons, ammunition, or fireworks
- NO perishable, tobacco, or alcohol products
- NO personal care items
- NO counterfeit items or items that violate copyright laws
- NO animals

DONATING OTHER ITEMS

Clothing and books are not accepted at FreeCycle Fest.

Clothing can be donated in a number of ways, including community clothing drives and the donation bins by the EMS building on Academy Street.

NP Memorial Library accepts book donations in the bin in parking lot and inside for their used bookstore, AfterWords.
