EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

BE PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY:

1. Create an Emergency Plan. Contact your local American Red Cross Chapter for information on potential disasters in your area.
[Register to receive SMART 911 Alert messages at www.newprov.us](#)
2. Put your plan down on paper and practice your escape plan once a month.
3. Designate an emergency meeting place in case you are separated from family members.
4. Prepare a Disaster Survival Kit.

The next time disaster strikes, you may not have much time to act. Whether the emergency is a power outage, winter storm, fire, hurricane, flood or thunderstorm, the best thing to do is to prepare now. Speak with your family members and prepare an emergency plan. Include special provisions for children and for any disabled family members. Remember, your children may be in school during the emergency. Once you have devised a plan, be sure to post it in your home so that all family members can refer to it easily. More importantly, practice your plan once a month by holding emergency escape drills. Test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and change the batteries regularly. Be sure to keep an up to date disaster survival kit . The following list will help you get started:

- Flashlights
- Battery operated or crank radio
- Extra batteries (fresh)
- Bottled water (1 gallon per day per person for 3 days)
- Sanitation supplies (bleach, etc.)
- Canned goods and non-perishable items (3 day supply)
- Manual can opener
- Candles and matches in waterproof container
- First Aid Kit and Prescription Medications
- Extra pet supplies
- Cellular telephone (if available)
- Special items for infants, elderly, or disabled family members.

NEW PROVIDENCE BOARD OF HEALTH

Westfield Regional Health Department

The Board of Health of New Providence is affiliated with the Westfield Regional Health Department, located at 425 East Broad Street, Westfield, New Jersey, 07090 (908-789-4070). The Westfield Regional Health Department offers a variety of health services for children, adults, and senior citizens.

BOARD OF HEALTH PERMITS

For establishments that receive Board of Health permits, permit fees are due by Jan. 31. There is a \$53 late fee for each month that payment is not received.

DOG AND CAT LICENSES

All dogs and cats in New Providence must be licensed with the Borough each year and have up-to-date rabies vaccinations. Beginning on or about January 7, 2026, you may license your pet online. Visit www.newprov.us and click the Online Business & Payments button, then select Pay for Pet Licenses.

Application, proof of current rabies immunization, and payment are due by 2/28/26. Failure to license is a violation of the Borough Code which may result in a summons and be subject to fines.

The Borough has two parking lots for commuters:

New Providence Train Station

The New Providence Train Station parking lot is located at 866 Springfield Avenue, between Willow Street and the tracks, opposite Pittsford Way.

Annual permits for Borough residents are available at the start of the fiscal year only (Apr. 1). Permits are then sold prorated on a monthly basis for the remainder of the year. See www.newprov.us for details.

Murray Hill Train Station

The Murray Hill Train Station parking lot is located at 1 Foley Place, at the corner of Southgate Road. Permits are available for residents (as above) and for non-residents.

Metered parking is also available along Floral Avenue, between South Street and Foley Place, for anyone, at \$7 per day (plus \$1 processing fee). Payment via the ParkMobile app. See www.newprov.us for details.

NEW eBIKE REGULATIONS

- Borough residents who own Class 1 and Class 2 eBike and eScooters now have to register them with the borough**
- eBike and eScooters require helmets for those under age 18 and must be operated on the roadway with the flow of traffic**
- They cannot be operated on the sidewalk or in any borough owned park**
- Riders are prohibited from using their mobile devices and using earphones while operating**

REMINDERS

THE SPEED LIMIT IS 25 MPH UNLESS OTHERWISE POSTED

Reminder—when parking always lock your car and take the key. Do not leave valuables in plain sight in your car when parked in public areas or at home.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

SNOW REMOVAL

Snow must be removed from public sidewalks within the first 24 hours from the time the storm ends. Sidewalks must be cleared. Do not plow or place snow onto roadways. Ice on sidewalks must be either removed or covered with salt, sawdust, sand or ashes within the first 24 hours after the formation of the ice.

BUILDING SAFETY IS NO ACCIDENT

The Borough Office of Planning & Development reminds you to contact their department before you plan a construction and/or development project. The following is a partial listing of projects which usually require prior approval and a zoning and or construction permit:

Building or installation of the following items: Decks, patios, covered patios, fence, garages, chimneys, ventilation systems, heating or air conditioning, supply or exhaust systems, swimming pool, or sheds.

Changing or additions to rooms: Including but not limited to kitchen, bathrooms, basements, demolition of or installing walls, converting garage, enclosing porches and dormers. Any plumbing or electrical changes such as replacement of gas or oil fired equipment, service upgrades, etc.

Demolition: Any structure, or part of a structure, and or any other changes that affect a structure. Sheds or in-ground pools would be included as well, as this would ensure that the structures are removed from the tax rolls.

Zoning & Land Use: Zoning review is a prerequisite to some construction permit applications. Zoning requirements are available on our website or by calling our office at (908) 665-1098. Questions regarding board applications, drainage or grading call (908) 665-1124.

Home Improvement Contractors must be registered with the Division of Consumer Affairs to work in the State of New Jersey.

WHAT IS CARBON MONOXIDE?

Carbon monoxide, or CO, is a colorless, tasteless and odorless gas. Because it can't be seen, tasted or smelled, its toxic fumes can kill you before you are even aware that it is present in your home. At lower levels of exposure, CO causes mild effects that are often mistaken for the flu, with symptoms that include headaches, dizziness, disorientation, nausea and fatigue. The effects of CO exposure can vary greatly from person to person depending on age, overall health, and the concentration and length of exposure.

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

Install at least one UL (Underwriters Laboratories) listed carbon monoxide detector with an audible warning signal outside of each sleeping area of your home. Carbon monoxide detectors measure levels of CO over time and are designed to sound an alarm before an average healthy adult would experience symptoms. It's possible that you may not be experiencing symptoms when you hear the alarm, but this does not mean that CO is not present. If you have any **NON-EMERGENCY** questions, call New Providence Fire Prevention (908) 665-1098.

IF YOUR FIRE ALARM SOUNDS, CALL 911 AND EVACUATE THE BUILDING

Prepare for Fires at Home

- At a minimum, smoke detectors should be located on every floor level and not more than 10 feet from each bedroom. For additional protection, smoke detectors should be placed inside of each sleeping area.
- If your smoke detectors were installed 7-10 years ago, you should consider replacing them.

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE COLLECTION (One Day Per Week)

TUESDAY, THURSDAY, OR FRIDAY

Please see the Garbage Collection Zones (Street List), pages 3 & 4, to determine your particular zone and thus, your day of the week for collection. Please note the symbol that corresponds to your pick up zone. **Garbage pickup may begin as early as 2 a.m. DO NOT place household waste at the curb prior to 5 p.m. the day before scheduled pick-up. Garbage must be placed in 32 gallon bins or smaller. Larger sizes will NOT be collected.**

General household garbage is collected in the borough ONCE PER WEEK, on Tuesdays, Thursdays, & Fridays. However, please note changes that occur on the following 2026 Holidays: New Year's Day (Thursday, Jan. 1) will be on Friday, Jan. 2 and Friday, Jan. 2 will be on Saturday, Jan. 3. Thanksgiving Day (Thursday, Nov. 26) will be on Friday, Nov. 27 and the Friday route will be on Saturday, Nov. 28. Christmas Day (Friday, Dec. 25) will be on Saturday, Dec. 26.

Household garbage is normal domestic garbage, which does not include bulk items, construction debris, hazardous waste, recyclable items, grass, brush and garden debris, and/or leaves. All electronic equipment (TV, radios, VCRs, stereos, etc.) must be recycled. You may no longer put them out with your bulk pickup. Instead, you can bring them to the public works yard on the first and third Saturday of each month from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. **For Missed Garbage and/or Brush pickup, call 973-227-7020 or email Suburban Disposal at notifysdi@gmail.com. DO NOT CALL DPW FOR MISSED GARBAGE OR BRUSH.** Please see the information regarding Bulk Collection, Hazardous Waste, Recycling, Grass, Brush and Garden Debris, and Leaf Collection in other sections found in this calendar.

All disposed materials are taken to the Union County Utilities Authority's Resource Recovery Facility on U. S. Route 1 in Rahway, New Jersey.

SPECIAL BULK COLLECTION (ONE TIME PER YEAR)

Bulk Collection occurs once a year in June.

Please check pages 3 and 4 for bulk collection dates (*subject to change*) and street listings by zone.

The borough contracts annually for a special collection of what is generally known as bulk collection. **Bulk Items** are items that are too large to fit in a regular garbage can, such as rugs, carpeting, and split-rail fencing (cannot be longer than four (4) feet in length and must be rolled and tied in liftable bundles), furniture, mattresses, household items, etc. Small items must be placed in a bag or container—*do not put loose items at curbside*. Please see section below for items that will **NOT** be collected with bulk.

IMPORTANT: You MAY NOT drop off the bulk items above at the DPW yard! They must be put at the curb for pick up by the garbage company.

All materials for disposal must be placed curbside, separated from normal household garbage, grass, brush materials, and recyclable materials, by 2 a.m. on the designated **MONDAY** for your zone.

While the actual collections will take more than one day in a given zone, once the truck has completed collection on your street, it will NOT return.

BULK ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE TAKEN

The following items **MAY NOT** be put out with bulk and **MAY NOT** be brought to the DPW Yard at any time. You must arrange for a private disposal company to remove the following items:

- **Construction debris** and materials, such as sheet rock, concrete, brick, lumber, plaster, roof shingles and other roofing materials, garage doors, etc.
- **Certain Household appliances**— refrigerators, dehumidifiers, and A/C units.
- **Firewood**, logs, trees, stumps, tree parts or any other type of garden waste
- **Cardboard** and similar packing materials will not be collected, as they are to be recycled on the regular recycling day. Please see additional information under **Recycling Collection on Page 19 of this calendar**.



(Bulk cont'd.) BULK ITEMS THAT WILL **NOT** BE TAKEN BUT **MAY** BE BROUGHT TO DPW

The following recyclable items **MAY NOT** be put out with bulk* but **MAY** be brought to the DPW Yard on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month, from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m.:

- **Household Appliances** (washing machines, dryers, hot water heaters, dishwashers, stoves, etc.)*
NO refrigerators, dehumidifiers, or A/C units - see page 13
- **Metal Items*** Any metal item may be brought to the public works yard during days and hours above.
- **Rigid Plastic*** (plastic outdoor play furniture, plastic sand boxes, plastic pools, large plastic toys, etc.)
- **Electronic Equipment** All electronic equipment must be recycled (fax machines, computers, printers, copiers, monitors, televisions, etc.)
- **Rimless Tires, Used Motor Oil and Antifreeze**
- **Paint Cans** if completely empty and dry (lids have been removed and sufficient time has elapsed for paint to dry into a solid mass). **DO NOT POUR PAINT DOWN SINK OR STORM DRAINS, AS THIS IS A VIOLATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS.**
- **Empty Gasoline Cans, Propane Tanks, and Gasoline-powered Equipment** (Propane gas tanks may also be taken to a propane supplier.)
- **Rechargeable Batteries and Car Batteries** (alkaline batteries should be put in regular household garbage)
- **Fluorescent Light Bulbs**

** These items may only be put out with bulk if they are too large to be brought to DPW on the 1st and 3rd Sat. of each month. Place these items separate from the other bulk items.*

1. Grass, brush and garden debris will be collected BOROUGH WIDE on MONDAYS ONLY, in separate garbage cans without lids, from Apr. 6, 2026 through Dec. 7, 2026. Containers must be placed at the curb by 2 a.m. each Monday.
2. EXCEPTIONS TO COLLECTION SCHEDULE: Memorial Day, Monday, May 25, will be moved to Wednesday, May 27; Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 7, will be moved to Wednesday, Sept. 9.
3. Grass clippings, leaves, and small twigs should be placed in open containers no larger than 32 gallons in size. No plastic bags will be accepted.
4. Branches up to four (4) inches in diameter and up to four (4) feet in length MUST BE TIED AND BUNDLED and placed at the curb. Branches up to four (4) inches in diameter may also be placed in a garbage can, but branches may NOT be taller than the top of the can. ANYTHING EXCEEDING THESE SIZES WILL NOT BE TAKEN.
5. NO FIREWOOD, LOGS, TREES, or TREE STUMPS will be collected.

BOROUGH TREE REMOVAL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

Chapter 247 of the *Code of Borough of New Providence* states:

No tree, in excess of four (4) inches in diameter measured one (1) foot above the ground, can be removed in the Borough of New Providence without first obtaining a tree removal permit from the Office of Planning & Development.

Any person, or persons, or company, etc. desiring to destroy and/or remove a tree of the above noted size, or larger, must first complete an application form for this permit, at the Office of Planning & Development in the Municipal Center. Said application needs to include, among other requirements, a sketch of the affected property indicating the locations of all trees, including those that are desired to be removed.

FEES FOR TREE REMOVAL ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- A. \$10 per tree for the first three (3) healthy trees removed from a property.
- B. Fourth healthy tree and beyond, \$55 per tree if the tree IS being replaced.
- C. Fourth healthy tree and beyond, if the tree IS NOT being Replaced, \$110 per tree, with \$75 dedicated to the Tree Replacement Fund
- D. No charge if the tree is dead, diseased or hazardous (documentation required).

In some instances depending on location, tree replacement may be required (see Chapter 247-6 for further specifications).

PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO OBTAIN PERMIT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- A. Owner or tenant shall pay \$100 per tree, up to the first three (3) trees, and \$300 per tree, in excess of the first three (3) trees.
- B. Contractor or Tree Service shall pay \$1,000 per tree.

ADDITIONAL PUBLIC WORKS INFOMATION

The following additional Public Works related information is offered for your reference and use:

1. STREET LIGHTS:

The Borough pays for all street lighting, on both Borough and Union County streets. Even when an individual light is burned out it still appears on the bill. When a light is on all day long it usually means that the photoelectric cell, which activates the light, has burned out and the light itself will soon burn out. All residents are strongly encouraged to please report burned out street lights, or lights on all day long, by calling 1-888-LIGHTSS (1-888-544-4877) or go to www.firstenergycorp.com. Report the utility pole number (Example: NP786E) found on the tag at "eye height," and its location (Example: corner of Livingston Ave. and Fourth St. or # XYZ Springfield Ave.)

2. TRAFFIC SIGNALS:

All traffic signals in the Borough, except for the New Jersey Transit crossing gates and signals, even when located on Union County streets, are owned and maintained by the Borough. Due to the virtual necessity of these signals and the resultant liability if they are not fully functioning, please report any burned out traffic signal bulbs or any other unusual condition to the Police Department by telephoning, as soon as possible, (908) 665-1111. Each reported condition will be immediately checked out and repaired as soon as possible thereafter by either the Public Works Department or contractor.

3. POTHOLE AND ADVERSE ROAD CONDITIONS:

Mountain Avenue, Passaic Street, Springfield Avenue and South Street are Union County streets and are maintained by The County of Union Department of Public Works. All other streets are Borough owned and maintained by the Borough of New Providence Department of Public Works.
